Dr. Josef Schenker, Chair, called the meeting to order. For the purposes of web casting, a roll call was performed. A quorum was present.

The Minutes of the January 23, 2018 REMAC Meeting were unanimously approved.

Voting Requirements. A quorum is based on the number of voting seats – whether they are filled or vacant. Currently, REMAC has 30 voting seats, so when voting, a majority of members must vote in the affirmative to pass any motion. That means, 16 votes in the affirmative are needed to pass any motion.

SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS

Executive Committee

The Executive Committee worked on developing a draft advisory to operationalize a proposed initiative to provide naloxone kits to the lay public in the event of a suspected opioid overdose (Draft REMAC Advisory 2018-xx: OD Leave behind Kits). Dr. Glenn Asaeda spoke to his concern that this not increase on-scene time. Dr. Asaeda

also reported NYC has already distributed over 120,000 kits. Nancy Benedetto stated REMSCO staff are working with NYC DOH to develop educational materials, including lists of treatment centers and support groups. Dr. Cindy Baselous recommended an educational video be created and posted on the REMSCO webpage. Video should include signs and symptoms of overdose. The Executive Committee brought this forward to the full REMAC for approval to release the advisory. A vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously.

Medical Standards (David Ben-Eli, MD, Chair)

The revised C&C Committee Administrative Manual was discussed and approved unanimously, via roll-call vote.

Pediatric transport time parameters from STAC were recently changed from 60 minutes allowed time to 30 minutes in NYC. This request for change was sent to STAC on February 2, 2018 (STAC meets on April 24, 2018). FDNY has already sent out an advisory directing its personnel of the transport time. Medical standards recommended that REMAC approve an advisory be issued to immediately implement. This would require an emergency changed to our GOP. REMAC voted unanimously to approve this change.

The next Medical Standards meeting will be held on February 20, 2018.

JOINT REMSCO/REMAC QA COMMITTEE UPDATE (MICHAEL REDLENER, MD, CHAIR)

The Joint Regional Emergency Medical Services Council/Regional Emergency Medical Advisory Committee (REMAC) Quality Improvement Committee met on Wednesday, February 7, 2018 at 5:00 PM. The following is a meeting summary:

Naloxone Study

Specific naloxone data will be requested.

Midazolam Study

Now that the REMSCO website is functioning, the survey will be distributed to EMS Agency Medical Directors. This survey will cover July 2016 to December 2016. Data will be due no later than March 7th, for presentation at the March 14th QA Meeting.

Safety Study (Mordy Lax)

There have been several large studies conducted. One such study was conducted by the National State EMS Organizations. Data from this study will be sent to QA Members. Literature shows that EMS fatigue is a national issue. Specific remedies have been recommended and should be considered for inclusion in a regional advisory.

Mobile Stroke Unit QA

Stroke transport decisions were discussed, limited to MSTU. Should this information be included in GOP or made into a regional advisory?

Development of QA for OLMC facilities

A check list and framework for QA process will be developed. ALS requirements will be reviewed and updated.

Stroke Systems of Care were discussed. A stake-holders meeting was held where regional plans were considered, A protocol is being developed, and once finalized, will be brought to Protocol Committee and then to REMAC. This may be ready for the March meeting. All REMAC and Medical Standards members were invited to attend the Pre-Hospital and Interfacility working groups.
