SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS

Executive Committee

The Executive Committee did not meet.

Medical Standards (David Ben-Eli, MD, Chair/Paul Barbara, MD, Vice-Chair)

The following revised documents are forwarded from the Medical Standards Committee in the form of seconded motions for consideration and vote:

1. Recommend approval of revised HazTac Protocols.

The revised protocols were emailed to REMAC members for review prior to 4/16/2019 meeting. If approved, a 30-day public notice will be initiated, and request for approval will be submitted to SEMAC. *Roll-call and written votes were conducted: 23 in favor*, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions. The motion carried.

2. Recommend approval of revised Academic Integrity Process.

The revised language was emailed to REMAC members for review prior to 4/16/2019 meeting. This process removes all electronic devices from attendees. Exam takers will be provided with a basic calculator, if requested. *Roll-call and written votes were conducted: 23 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions. The motion carried.*

3. Recommend approval of ET3 (Emergency Triage/Treatment/Transport) language for inclusion into General Operating Procedures (GOP).

This initiative focuses on the identification and transportation of patents to alternative destinations. Proposed language for inclusion into General Operating Procedures (GOP) was emailed to REMAC members for review prior to 4/16/2019 meeting. If approved, a 30-day public notice will be initiated, and request for approval will be submitted to SEMAC.

An amendment to remove "...or potentially unstable..." from the first bullet was accepted. Roll-call and written votes were conducted: 23 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions. The motion with the amendment carried.

4. Proposed demonstration project for administration of Ketamine via specialized nebulizer.

Dr. Matt Freidman discussed a proposed project for delivering ketamine via specialized nebulizer. REMAC requested a formal submission for review. Joseph Bove motioned to table further discussion to the June meeting, seconded by Robert Crupi; the motion carried (11 in favor, 8 opposed, 1 abstention). This will be discussed at the next meeting.

Dr. Robert Crupi reported that the Regional Emergency Medical Services Council of New York City met on March 26, 2019. The following is a meeting summary:

- Transfer of Operating Authority was approved for Middle Village VAC to Ridgewood VAC.

- A process to clarify operating territory is being developed.
- Private ambulance agencies that participated in SurgEx were thanked.
- REMSCO offices continue to distribute naloxone.
- The ability for agencies to join ePCR program (N3 platform) at not cost has re-opened.

Mobile Stroke Treatment Unit (MSTU) Interface language was circulated to members. This will clarify standard evaluation of stroke patients using NYC S-LAMS and operational issues. This was discussed and voted upon as follows: 20 in favor, 0 opposed, 1 abstention. The language was approved. A REMAC Advisory will be developed and issued.

NEW BUSINESS

The formation of an ET3 Tag separate from the Community Paramedicine Tag was approved. The new tag will meet weekly. The REMAC Chair will appoint TAG members and select the Chair.
