Svetlana Lipyanskaya, MPA, FACHE is the Chief Executive Officer of NYC Health + Hospitals/South Brooklyn Health.

Since her appointment in 2020, she has guided the hospital through the COVID-19 pandemic, its extensive testing and vaccination programs, and the post-pandemic recovery. As a part of Superstorm Sandy recovery, Svetlana drove the effort to complete and open the new \$923 million storm-resistant Ruth Bader Ginsburg Hospital facility, ensuring that patients have access to the care they need regardless of future environmental challenges.

She is the first woman to lead South Brooklyn Health, where she spearheads strategies focused on delivering transformative patient-centered care, including an interdisciplinary quality program that significantly improved the hospital's Leapfrog grade from a D to a B. The quality redesign focused on reducing hospital-acquired conditions, which yielded meaningful reductions in pressure injuries, Central Line-Associated Bloodstream Infections (CLABSI), and Catheter-Associated Urinary Tract Infections (CAUTI) – including over one year with no CAUTI hospital-wide.



Svetlana is focusing on the continued development of a comprehensive state-of-the-art medical and behavioral ambulatory care program for South Brooklyn Health, expanding services and providing a continuum of care in one coordinated space. Her efforts embody the NYC Health + Hospitals mission to transform care delivery, strengthen the health of her community, and provide high-quality, affordable, and compassionate health care to all New Yorkers. She has collaborated with government officials and the South Brooklyn Health Auxiliary to secure funding for vital infrastructure projects in an ongoing effort to improve access to critical lifesaving services for the communities she serves.

Prior to leading South Brooklyn Health, Svetlana has held several senior roles within the NYC Health + Hospitals system, responsible for driving corporate strategy, leading systemwide business planning, and driving multiple performance improvement initiatives. Before that she spent fifteen years in the Weill Cornell Medicine system.

Svetlana has received multiple recognitions in City & State's Brooklyn Power 100, was named by Becker's Hospital Review as a Community Hospital CEO to Know, and was highlighted by PoliticsNY as a Power Player in Healthcare. She was also recognized on the NY State Assembly floor for her efforts in the healthcare sector, and is an active member of the Healthcare Association of New York State Board of Directors, where she sits on the executive committee.

A proud native of Brooklyn, Svetlana holds an MPA in Healthcare Administration and Finance and a BA in Economics from New York University. She is also a Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives (FACHE).

1. The names of the corporations included in the consolidation are as follows:-

(a) Beth Mosess Hospital of Brooklyn, duly formed and organized under the Membership Corporation Law of the State of New York, the Certificate of Incorporation of which was duly filed with the Secretary of State of the State of New York on July 28, 1916;

(b) Israel Zion Hospital, duly formed and organized under the Membership Corporation Law of the State of New York. The name under which this corporation was originally incorporated was New Utrecht Dispensary, the Certificate of Incorporation of which was duly filed in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of New York on September 27, 1911. Thereafter, the name of said New Utrecht Dispensary was changed to Israel Hospital of Brooklyn by certificate duly filed in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of New York on April 17, 1919. Thereafter, the said Israel Hospital of Brooklyn entered into a consolidation agreement with the Zion Hospital, Inc., which said consolidation agreement was duly approved by order of Mr. Justice David F. Manning entered on or about April 29, 1920, a certified copy of which was filed with the Secretary of State of the State of New York on May 14, 1920. The said Zion Hospital, Inc., was duly incorporated pursuant to Section 130 of the Membership Corporation Law of the State of New York and

Thereafter, by Certificate of Change of Name the said merged institution caused its name to be changed from United Israel-Zion Hospital to its present name, Israel Zion Hospital, and said Certificate was duly filed in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of New York on February 29, 1932. There have been no further changes in said corporation since said date.

2. The name of the consolidated corporation shall be: MAIMONIDES HOSPITAL OF BROOKLYN.

3. The purposes for which the consolidated corporation is formed are as follows:-

(a) To own and operate a hospital and dispensary at two locations and to maintain, support, care and provide for, instruct and aid in offering medical and surgical aid and nursing to sick or disabled persons, medical and surgical treatment, lying-in pavilion for maternity cases, facilities for research and advancement in the medical and surgical arts and sciences, opportunity to students in medicine to acquire a knowledge of the art of medicine and surgery, training of nurses and instruction in the care and nursing of the sick;

(b) The Mosaic dietary laws shall be strictly observed and religious services at the consolidated hospital shall be conducted in conformity with the doctrines and forms of the Jewish faith and Jewish dietary laws. Nothing herein contained, however, shall be construed to prohibit the atten-

dance of any clergyman of any other faith upon the request of any patient;

(c) To investigate, either alone or in co-operation with other social welfare agencies, the conditions, requirements and needs of persons applying for medical aid or assistance to the consolidated corporation;

(d) The consolidated corporation shall have the power to take and hold by grant, gift, devise, bequest, purchase, lease or in any other manner, either absolutely, in trust, or otherwise, for any of the purposes and objects of said corporation, any real or personal property, without limitation as to amount, necessary or proper for such purposes and objects.

4. The territory in which the operations of the consolidated corporation are to be principally conducted, is the City of New York and its suburbs and the State of New York.

5. The principal office of the corporation is to be located in the City of New York, County of Kings and State of New York.

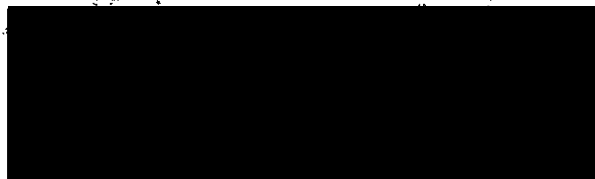

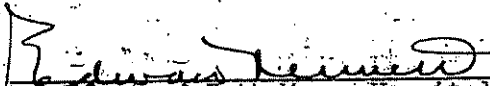

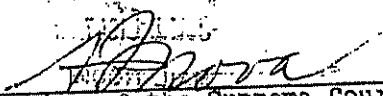

LAWS OF NEW YORK.—By Authority

CHAPTER 834

AN ACT to provide for the consolidation of the Beth Moses hospital and Israel Zion Hospital, and to provide for certain powers of the consolidated corporation

Became a law April 12, 1947, with the approval of the Governor. Passed, three-fifths being present

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The Beth Moses Hospital and Israel Zion Hospital, corporations heretofore duly organized under the laws of this state, are hereby authorized and empowered to enter into an agreement or agreements for consolidation of such corporations and such corporations so agreeing shall be consolidated, in all respects as if consolidation had been effected pursuant to the membership corporations law, into a single corporation, upon the filing of a certificate which shall be entitled and endorsed "certificate of consolidation forming

pursuant to chapter forty-seven" of the laws of nineteen hundred (the blank spaces being filled in with the name of the corporation formed by the consolidation, and the chapter number of this act) and which shall state:

1. The name of each corporation to be included in the consolidation and the date of filing of its certificate of incorporation in the office of the secretary of state, or if any such corporation was created by special law and has no certificate of incorporation, the chapter number and year of passage of such law.

2. The name of the consolidated corporation, which name may be that of one of the constituent corporations or an entirely new name permitted under the provisions of section nine of the general corporation law.

3. The purposes for which the consolidated corporation is formed, which purposes may be any or all of the purposes of one or more of the constituent corporations and any other purposes for which a membership corporation may be formed.

4. The territory in which its operations are principally to be conducted.

5. The city, village or town and the county in which its principal office is to be located.

6. The number of its trustees or that the number of trustees shall not be less than a stated minimum nor more than a stated maximum. In either case the number of trustees shall not be less than three.

7. The names and residences of the trustees, and if any such trustee shall reside in a city, the street and number or other particular description of his residence. The number of trustees so named

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must be the number stated pursuant to the last preceding subdivision of this section if a definite number be stated, or, if an indefinite number be provided for, not less than the minimum number nor more than the maximum number.

The certificate shall specify that each trustee named in the certificate shall serve until the first annual meeting of the corporation shall be held, which shall be on or before April thirtieth, nineteen hundred forty-eight, at which annual meeting the whole number of trustees shall be divided into three classes equal in number (or as near equal as may be) and each class shall be elected to serve for a term of one or two years or three years, respectively.

Upon the expiration of the term of office of any trustee, or upon any vacancy occurring in the office of any trustee from any cause, the successor of such trustee shall be elected by a majority vote of the remaining members of the board of trustees.

B. The terms and conditions of the consolidation, if any. Such certificate shall be subscribed and acknowledged by the president or a vice president and the secretary or an assistant secretary of each of the constituent corporations who shall make and annex an affidavit stating that they have been authorized to execute and file such certificate by the vote of at least two-thirds of the whole number of the persons then serving as trustees or directors of such corporation.

Such certificate shall have endorsed thereon or annexed thereto the approval of a justice of the supreme court of the judicial district in which the principal office of the corporation is to be located. The petition for such approval shall set forth the agreement or agreements for consolidation, a summary statement of the major items of property, the amount of any long term or funded indebtedness, and the principal sources of the annual income of each constituent corporation.

The written approval of the state board of social welfare shall be annexed to the certificate.

Such certificate shall be filed in the department of state and the secretary of state shall make, certify and transmit a copy thereof to the clerk of the county in which the principal office of the consolidated corporation is to be located, which copy shall be filed by such clerk. A filing fee of forty dollars shall be paid to the department of state upon the filing of such certificate.

§ 2. (a) Upon such consolidation, the consolidated corporation shall be a "membership corporation" subject to the provisions of the membership corporations law, and all the provisions of the membership corporations law shall apply to such corporation, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions of this act. At the time of such consolidation, the persons named as trustees of the consolidated corporation in the certificate of consolidation filed pursuant to section one of this act shall be and become the members of the consolidated corporation, which membership shall be subject to termination in accordance with the constitution and by-laws of the consolidated corporation, which constitution

and by-laws may make provisions, not inconsistent with law or with this act, regulating the admission of additional members, the voluntary withdrawal, suspension and expulsion of members and the termination of membership.

(b) The consolidated corporation shall have the power to take and hold by grant, gift, devise, bequest, purchase, lease, or in any other manner, either absolutely, in trust, or otherwise, for any of the purposes and objects of said corporation, any real or personal property, without limitation as to amount, necessary or proper for such purposes and objects.

(c) The consolidated corporation shall possess all the powers of the constituent corporations, and shall have the powers and be subject to the duties and obligations of a membership corporation formed for like purposes. All the rights, privileges, immunities, estates and interests of each of the constituent corporations, all the property, real, personal and mixed, and all the debts due on whatever account to them, and other things in action belonging to them, shall be deemed to be transferred to and vested in such consolidated corporation without further act or deed, and all claims, demands, property and every other right, estate and interest shall be as effectually the property of and vested in the consolidated corporation as they were of or vested in the constituent corporations, and the title to all real estate, taken by deed or otherwise under the laws of this state, vested in the constituent corporations shall not be deemed to revert or be in any way impaired by reason of the consolidation but shall be vested in the consolidated corporation.

Any devise, bequest, gift or grant contained in any will or other instrument, in trust or otherwise, made before or after such consolidation to or for any of the constituent corporations shall inure to the benefit of the consolidated corporation, and so far as necessary for that purpose the existence of the constituent corporations shall be deemed to continue in and through the consolidated corporation.

The consolidated corporation shall be deemed to have assumed and shall be liable for all the liabilities and obligations of the constituent corporations in the same manner as if such consolidated corporation had itself incurred such liabilities or obligations.

§ 3. The constitution and by-laws of the consolidated corporation may contain any provision authorized by the membership corporations law not inconsistent with this act and may but need not, among other things, (a) fix the number of trustees necessary to constitute a quorum of the board of trustees at a meeting; such number shall not be less than fifteen members of the board; and to fix the vote or votes of the trustees necessary to constitute the action of the board of trustees; (b) provide for the creation of committees of the board of trustees, to which the board of trustees may delegate such authority which may be lawfully delegated as it deems desirable with respect to the business and affairs of the consolidated corporation and the management of its property, real and personal; (c) provide for the creation of an executive committee which shall consist of seventeen members of the board

of trustees, except that for the first five years of the corporation's existence, one member of such executive committee shall be designated by the President of the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies of New York and shall be the chairman of such executive committee; such executive committee shall have full power and authority in all matters of administration of the medical, surgical and nursing institutions of the corporation and in connection with its scientific and research activities and shall formulate all policies designed to develop and improve the service of the hospital; it shall have full power and authority in all matters pertaining to appointments, promotions or dismissals of the medical staff and its members, and shall consider and pass upon all charges against members of the medical staff, and shall have full power and authority and jurisdiction in the creation of clinical and research divisions in the specialties of medicine within the hospital and the assignment of hospital beds and out-patient facilities to each specialty; (d) fix the qualifications of trustees; fix the term of office of the trustees to be elected after the expiration of the terms of office of the trustees named in the certificate of consolidation filed pursuant to section one of this act, which term so to be fixed shall not be longer than three years nor less than one year; provide for the election by the board of trustees of trustees to succeed those whose term of office expires and to fill vacancies; define a vacancy in the board of trustees and provide for the removal of trustees. The initial constitution and by-laws of the consolidated corporation shall be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the trustees of the consolidated corporation named in the certificate of consolidation filed pursuant to section one of this act unless they shall have been previously embodied in the agreement or agreements of consolidation; the constitution and by-laws so adopted shall be subject to amendment, modification or repeal in the manner therein provided.

§ 4. The provisions of this act shall be effective; any of the provisions of the membership corporations law or any general or special law, or of any charter, constitution or by-laws of any of the said corporations to the contrary notwithstanding.

§ 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

(e) to conduct any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful or desirable for the furtherance, accomplishment, or attainment of the foregoing purposes, so long as consistent with the Corporation's authority pursuant to the Act.

NINTH. The Board of Directors of the Corporation shall have the authority and responsibility for the general management, control and supervision of the Corporation's affairs, business, activities and assets; provided, however, the Member shall have (a) such powers as are set forth in the Bylaws of the Corporation, and (b) such authority as set forth in the Act.

TENTH. The following language relates to the Corporation's tax-exempt status and is not a statement of purposes and powers. Consequently, this language does not expand or alter the Corporation's purposes or powers as set forth herein. Notwithstanding any other provision in this Certificate of Incorporation:

(a) The Corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable, educational, and scientific purposes as specified in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code").

(b) No part of the Corporation's net earnings shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, any trustee, director, officer or employee of the Corporation or other private person; provided, however, that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation to any person for services rendered to or for the Corporation in furtherance of one or more of its purposes set forth in Article Sixth hereof;

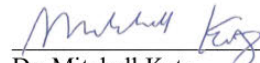
(c) No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation (except to the extent permitted by Section 501(h) of the Code if the Corporation makes an election thereunder), and the Corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or the distributing of statements in connection with) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office;

(d) The Corporation shall neither have nor exercise any power, nor shall it engage directly or indirectly in any activity, that would invalidate its status as a corporation which is exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(a) of the Code as an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, nor shall it carry on any activity not permitted to be carried on by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Sections 170(c)(2), 2055(a) or 2522(a) of the Code;

(e) During such period, or periods, of time as the Corporation is treated as a “private foundation” pursuant to Section 509 of the Code, the directors must distribute the Corporation’s income at such time and in such manner so as not to subject the Corporation to tax under Section 4942 of the Code, and the Corporation is prohibited from engaging in any act of self-dealing (as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Code), from retaining excess business holdings (as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Code) which would subject the Corporation to tax under Section 4943 of the Code, from making any investments or otherwise acquiring assets in such manner so as to subject the Corporation to tax under Section 4944 of the Code, from retaining any assets which would subject the Corporation to tax under Section 4944 of the Code if the directors have acquired such assets, and from making any taxable expenditures (as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Code).

ELEVENTH. In the event of dissolution or final liquidation of the Corporation, subject to compliance with the Act, all of the remaining assets and property of the Corporation shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities and obligations of the Corporation and for the necessary expenses thereof, be distributed to the federal government or to a state or local government for a public purpose.

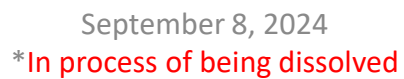
