The Regional Emergency Medical Advisory Committee (REMAC) of New York City is responsible to develop, approve and implement prehospital treatment and transport protocols for use within the five boroughs of the City of New York. The Regional Emergency Medical Advisory Committee (REMAC) of New York City operates under the auspices of Article Thirty of the New York State Public Health Law.

We are pleased to announce that NYC REMSCO has launched a new online learning management system (LMS). This new system will support greater training capabilities in the region including online, virtual, in person, and asynchronous educational opportunities. It will also serve as the delivery platform for NYC REMAC protocol updates and Paramedic re-credentialing per [2022-05 REMAC Advisory NYC Paramedic Re-credentialing](#) now in effect.

Agency training coordinators and medical directors:

- [2022-07 REMAC Advisory Protocol Update](#) issued on December 1, 2022, included guidance for agencies to submit names and information for their training coordinators to manage their providers as well as register for training sessions. If you have not completed this process, email jraneri@nycremsco.org to obtain training coordinator access and video-based training on the system.

Access to LMS for Regional EMS Providers:

- All EMS providers in the region are **required to sign up** for access to the LMS to complete mandatory protocol updates and track all regional training. To do so go to <https://nycremsco.org/learning-management-system-lms/>

Mandatory Protocol Updates

- Once registered in the LMS, all providers will automatically be assigned the protocol update applicable to their certification level. Upon successful completion, a certificate will be awarded with NYS DOH Elective CME for all providers and NYC REMAC CME credit for paramedics. Paramedics' CME credit will also be logged in their transcript and count toward recertification.
